The Street committee and Board of Public Works met.

Motion by Dunbar, seconded by Kavan, to table public hearing on the Wahoo Comprehensive Plan to the November 9, 2017 council meeting. Roll call vote: Dunbar, yes; Kavan, yes; Tyler, yes; Krejci, yes; Svoboda, yes; and Lawver, yes. Absent and not voting: none. Motion carried.

Harrell reviewed the on-line opinion poll, which showed 55% of participants in favor of keeping the stop light at 5<sup>th</sup> and Chestnut, 45% against. Pedestrian safety and creating a break in traffic for vehicles crossing Chestnut during busy times were cited as reasons for keeping the signal. Cost was a concern.

Jon Mooberry with JEO Consulting Group discussed the proposed Amendment #4 to the engineering agreement for Chestnut Street Improvements, which provides design services for street lighting. Motion was made by Krejci, seconded by Tyler, to approve Amendment #4 to the engineering agreement with JEO Consulting Group. Roll call vote: Krejci, yes; Tyler, yes; Svoboda, yes; Lawver, yes; Dunbar, yes; and Kavan, yes. Absent and not voting: none. Motion carried.

Amendment #5 to the engineering agreement for Chestnut Street improvements, providing engineering services for replacement and relocation of the traffic signal light was discussed. A motion was made by Svoboda, seconded by Kavan, to not approve Amendment #5 for design services for the traffic signal light.

Roll call vote: Svoboda, yes; Kavan, yes; Dunbar, yes; Lawver, no; Tyler, yes; and Krejci, no. Absent and not voting: none. Motion carried.

It was determined more information is needed on a "no overhead wire" zone in the Chestnut/1<sup>st</sup> Street project area. Motion by Lawver, seconded by Dunbar, to table action. Roll call vote: Lawver, yes; Dunbar, yes; Svoboda, yes; Krejci, yes; Tyler, yes; and Kavan, yes. Absent and not voting: none. Motion carried.

Encroachment into Maple Street ROW as requested by Wahoo Locker to install a new grease trap was discussed. Conditions of placement of tank to minimize encroachment, installation of bollards, and making the encroachment easement revocable in the event of further remodel/expansion of the locker plant building or city projects were noted. A legal description has been provided.

**Ordinance No. 2257** was introduced by Kavan entitled: AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WAHOO TO GRANT A REVOCABLE EASEMENT OF ENCROACHMENT INTO THE MAPLE STREET RIGHT-OF-WAY IN BLOCK 152, COUNTY ADDITION, FOR INSTALLATION OF A GREASE TRAP AND SEWER LINE. The Mayor then instructed the Clerk to read Ordinance No. 2257 of the City of Wahoo, Nebraska. The Clerk thereupon read the aforesaid Ordinance No. 2257 by title.

Council Member Lawver moved that the statutory rules in regard to the passage and adoption of ordinances be suspended so that the said ordinance might be introduced, read by title, and then moved for final passage at the same meeting. Council Member Krejci seconded said motion. The Mayor put the question and instructed the Clerk to call for the roll for the vote thereon. The passage and adoption of said Ordinance having been concurred then by a majority of all members of the Council, the Mayor declared the Ordinance adopted and, in the presence of the Council, signed and approved the Ordinance and Clerk attested the passage and approval of the same and affixed signatures thereto. The Mayor ordered the Ordinance to be published in pamphlet form and that said Ordinance be kept in a separate and distinct Ordinance volume record, and that said and distinct Volume be incorporated and made a part of these proceedings the same as though it was read at large herein.

A claim for \$96.52 submitted by Nebraska Banker's Association for repairs to a vehicle was reviewed. Motion by Svoboda, seconded by Tyler, to pay the claim. Roll call vote: Svoboda, yes; Tyler, yes; Krejci, yes; Dunbar, yes; Lawver, yes; and Kavan, yes. Absent and not voting: none. Motion carried.

Motion by Lawver, seconded by Kavan, to approve waiver of Section 113.02 of Wahoo Municipal Code regarding hours of sale for alcoholic beverages to allow for sales of liquor and wine between 6:00 a.m. and 12:00 p.m. on Sunday, December 24, 2017 and Sunday, December 31, 2017. Roll call vote: Lawver, yes; Kavan, yes; Tyler, yes; Dunbar, yes; Svoboda, yes; and Krejci, yes. Absent and not voting: none. Motion carried.

Ordinance No. 2256 was introduced for second reading by Svoboda entitled: AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WAHOO, SAUNDERS COUNTY, NEBRASKA, TO AMEND TITLE IX: GENERAL REGULATIONS, CHAPTER 98, TREES AND SHRUBS, BY ADDITION OF SECTION 98.10 PROVIDING FOR LICENSING OF PERSONS ENGAGING IN THE BUSINESS OF CUTTING, PRUNING, OR REMOVING TREES; TO AMEND TITLE XI: BUSINESS REGULATIONS, CHAPTER 111: PROFESSIONAL LICENSES, BY CREATION OF SECTION 111.70, TREE CONTRACTOR LICENSING, AND SECTION 112.01(A) OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF WAHOO, NEBRASKA, PERTAINING TO OCCUPATION TAXES BY ESTABLISHING TREE CONTRACTOR LICENSE OCCUPATION TAX RATES.
